In 1992-4 WOW helped create an alphabet for the Winye language and literacy materials in Ouri, Burkina Faso. Our national translator Nicolas spent the next dozen years teaching his people to read and write their language.





WOW returned in 2014 to bring Moringa saplings and audio books to the villages surrounding Ouri.





Currently in 2017 there are 17 villages surrounding Ouri that all feed into the only high school in the region. The students have no exposure to computers or vocational skills and can not find employment. Nicolas and the mayor would like to start a second high school that would offer students basic computer skills. WOW suggested the mayor ask Samsung for SPIS schools or look elsewhere for donations. If the town could get facilities, WOW offered to come and train high school students for a year. Would you be interested in teaching English or MS Office or other computer skills in Ouri for a year? Could you help Ouri look for grants to purchase a Solar Powered Internet School? The only utilities that exist in Ouri are cell phones. Water must be fetched from a well and electronics are run off batteries.
